What is the International Baccalaureate?



The International Baccalaureate Organization was established in 1968 to meet the educational needs of students in International Schools. From these early days it has grown to an organization that teaches over 1 million students in 3681 schools in 146 countries. The IB is now taught in both International Schools and State sector schools across the globe, with the highest number of schools being in the United States.

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) is based in Geneva with its head curriculum office for the Africa, Europe and Middle Eastern (AEM) region located in The Hague, Netherlands.

There are regional offices that deal with Professional Development and administration of the program in different parts of the world in the Asia Pacific, South America, North America and Europe, Middle East and Africa.

The IB offers three programmes, the Primary Years Programme (PYP); the Middle Years Programme (MYP) and the Diploma Programme (DP). At EISM we follow at IB Programmes. This offers a seamless transition and fully embeds the IB philosophy in students from entry into the school.

Why has EISM chosen to be an IB World School?

The IB is recognized as one of the pre-eminent curriculum programmes worldwide. It is a holistic, rigorous curriculum that helps prepare students for the realities of life in the 21st Century. It is heavily focused on critical thinking and problem solving, whilst attempting to encourage international mindedness, compassion, tolerance and a love for learning.

The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

To this end the organization works with schools, governments and international organizations to develop challenging programmes of international education and rigorous assessment. These programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

Embracing the IB Mission Statement, the MYP has been devised at EISM to guide students in their search for a sense of belonging in the real world around them. The course also aims to help students develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills they need to participate actively and responsibly in a changing and increasingly interrelated world.

We teach students to become independent learners who can recognise relationships between school subjects and the world outside the classroom.

Three Fundamental Concepts in the MYP

Intercultural Awareness

Developing students' attitudes, knowledge and skills as they learn about their own and others social and national cultures. By encouraging students to consider multiple perspectives, intercultural awareness not only fosters tolerance and respect but also leads to empathy and understanding.

Holistic Education

Emphasise the links between disciplines which provide a global view of situations and issues. Students should see the cohesion and relevance of their learning. They make links between the various fields of study but in so doing retain their own objectives and methodology.

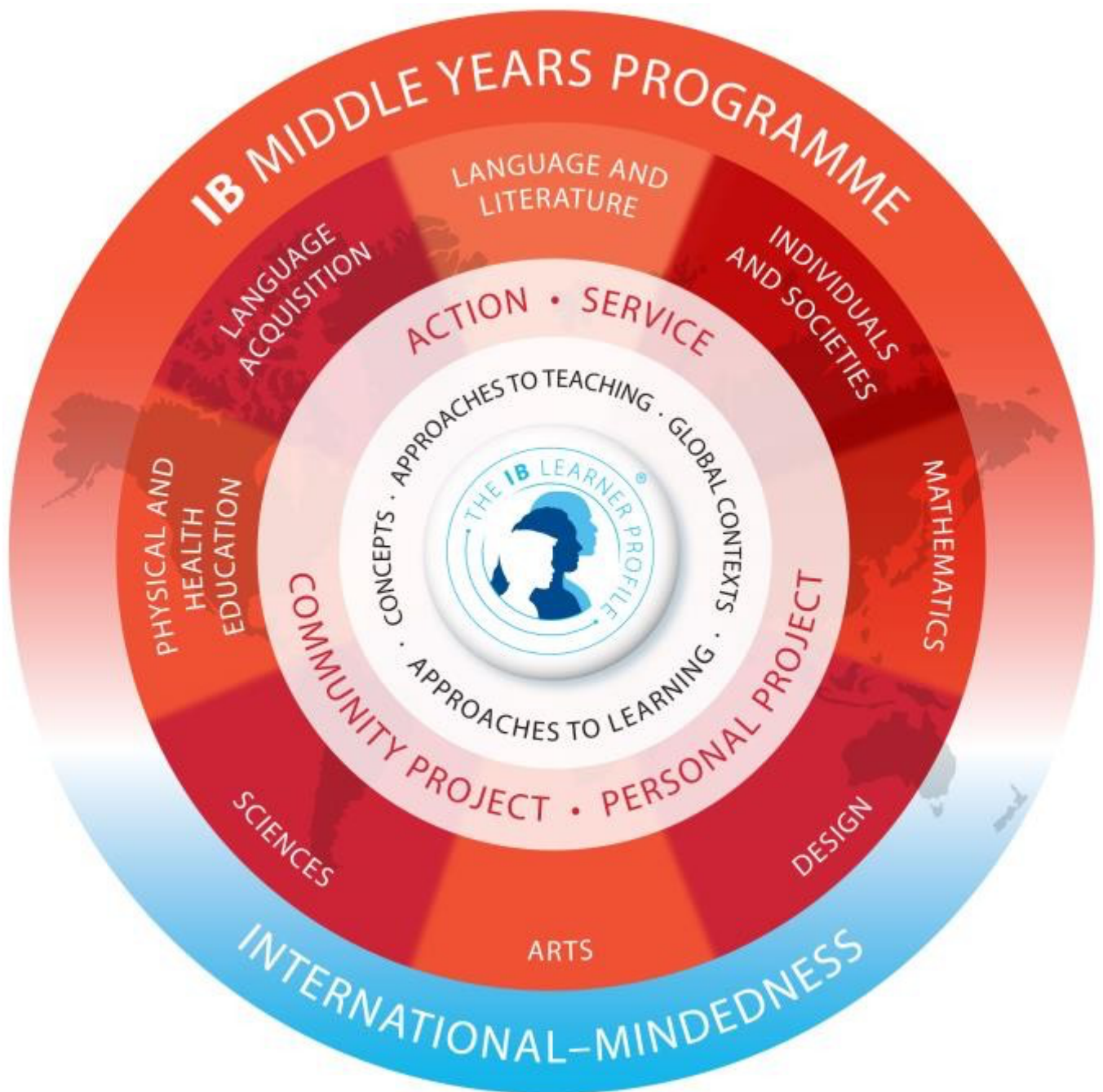
Communication

The MYP stresses the central importance of communication, which is fundamental to all learning as it supports enquiry-based understanding and allows for reflection and expression.

How is the Middle Years Programme defined?

- For students aged 11-16
- A framework of Academic challenge
- A concept-based curriculum
- Inquiry driven
- Develops a notion of awareness and understanding, action and reflection
- 8 subject groups, Service as Action and Personal Project

Assessment



How does assessment work?

Year 11 students must register for at least 6 subjects of their 8 group subject groups to be eligible for MYP Certification. They will be required to sit e-Assessments in six of their subject choices.

- Language and Literature
- Language Acquisition
- Mathematics
- Sciences
- Individuals and Societies
- IDU

Each e-Assessment will be two hours in duration and will focus on the global context which will be announced in November each year. All e-Assessments will be marked externally, whilst the interdisciplinary unit will be based around the global context chosen for each session and pre-release materials will be available in April of Year 11.

For the remaining subject groups students moderated externally in the form of an e-portfolio (students will study one of these subjects)

These subject groups are;

- Physical and Health Education
- Digital Design
- Music
- Visual Art
- Drama

Students are required to undertake the personal project activity in Year 11. This is a self-selected area of study which culminates in a final public display and exhibition. The purpose is to encourage students to identify and pursue areas of study which reflect upon their personal strengths and passions. Students will begin the process in the Summer of Year 10 to give them appropriate time over the Summer vacation to pursue research and gather information.

Personal Projects are assessed by their Supervisor and samples are sent to IB for moderation.

E-portfolios are marked internally but moderated externally. The e-Assessments, e-Portfolios and the Personal Projects each count towards the MYP Certificate and are mandatory components.
